

Relationship of Geography to other disciplines

- The fields of human knowledge are divided into 3: a. natural sciences, b. social sciences, and c. humanities.
- Geography belongs to the field of natural sciences
- Geography-studies nature, water, landforms, minerals, soil, climate, and flora and fauna.
- - also a social science which deals with the study of man as the architect of earth's surface.
- -studies man's political and economic systems, religious and educational institutions, man's cultural values, folkways and beliefs.
